What is HathiTrust?

HathiTrust is a not-for-profit collaborative of 200+ academic and research libraries, preserving 17.4+ million digitized items. HathiTrust offers reading access to the fullest extent allowable by U.S. copyright law, computational access to the entire corpus for scholarly research, and other emerging services based on the combined collection. HathiTrust stewards this collection under the aims of scholarly, not corporate, interests. HathiTrust holds the largest set of digitized books managed by the academic, research, and library community.

Mission: The mission of HathiTrust is to contribute to research, scholarship, and the common good by collaboratively collecting, organizing, preserving, communicating, and sharing the record of human knowledge.

Vision: HathiTrust will be a vital catalyst for emerging forms of research, teaching, and learning that engage the scholarly and cultural record.

What does HathiTrust do?

HathiTrust members participate in the development of a common good service while accessing services and programs that benefit their users. Working collaboratively through member libraries, the organization aims to transform research libraries to serve the wider scholarly enterprise and to address large scale challenges libraries collectively face and can better solve together. HathiTrust manages programs to find and open public domain materials, to expand access to U.S. federal publications, to develop a distributed, shared network of print collections, and to develop services that support advanced computational research.
