More Information about the Creative Commons licenses and CC0 Public Domain Dedication

Below, you will find brief descriptions of each of the Creative Commons licenses and the public domain dedication, from the Creative Commons website. Creative Commons Attribution 4.0 license (CC BY 4.0)

This license lets others distribute, remix, tweak, and build upon your work, even commercially, as long as they credit you for the original creation. This is the most accommodating of licenses offered. Recommended for maximum dissemination and use of licensed materials.

Creative Commons Attribution ShareAlike 4.0 license (CC BY-SA 4.0)

This license lets others remix, tweak, and build upon your work even for commercial purposes, as long as they credit you and license their new creations under the identical terms. This license is often compared to “copyleft” free and open source software licenses. All new works based on yours will carry the same license, so any derivatives will also allow commercial use. This is the license used by Wikipedia, and is recommended for materials that would benefit from incorporating content from Wikipedia and similarly licensed projects.

Creative Commons Attribution NonCommercial 4.0 license (CC BY-NC 4.0)

This license lets others remix, tweak, and build upon your work non-commercially, and although their new works must also acknowledge you and be non-commercial, they don't have to license their derivative works on the same terms.

Creative Commons Attribution NonCommercial ShareAlike 4.0 license (CC BY-NC-SA 4.0) This license lets others remix, tweak, and build upon your work non-commercially, as long as they credit you and license their new creations under the identical terms.

Creative Commons Attribution NoDerivatives 4.0 license (CC BY-ND 4.0)

This license allows for redistribution, commercial and non-commercial, as long as it is passed along unchanged and in whole, with credit to you.

Creative Commons Attribution NonCommercial NoDerivatives 4.0 license (CC BY-NC-ND 4.0)

This license is the most restrictive of the six main licenses, only allowing others to download your works and share them with others as long as they credit you, but they can't change them in any way or use them commercially.

Creative Commons Public Domain Dedication (CC0 1.0)

The Public Domain Dedication (CC0) enables rights holders to opt out of copyright and related rights. Creative Commons describes this as the “no rights reserved” alternative to its licenses.
